Lord, send us your Spirit so we may bring new vigor to renewing ourselves and our world.

Pentecost is regarded as the birthday of the Church. The Apostles had locked themselves in the Upper Room in fear. But then God unleashed an unheard-of-power upon them. They courageously burst out of their private little room into the public square, driven by wind and fire, to spread throughout the world the presence of God that had come to us from the Father of Jesus Christ.

Quite often we are very much like the pre-Pentecost Apostles, huddled together in fear of what’s going on in the world’s marketplace and the culture that surrounds us, which can be hostile.

The coming of the Holy Spirit brought a sense of unity and purpose to those fractured eleven Apostles. More importantly, it brought one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all in Jesus Christ. The Church was endowed with unity and universality so the hearts of all could be touched, and the lives of all could be shared in the one Christ, in the one bread and in the one cup, in the one Church.

## Announcements

With Pentecost Sunday, Easter season come to an end. Just as a typical calendar has four seasons, twelve months, fifty-two weeks, and 365 days that include holidays, solemn days, commemorative days, and days that are just “average,” the Liturgical Year Calendar of the Church uses similar terms and measurements.

The Liturgical Year is also marked by special seasons—Advent, Christmas, Lent, The Triduum or Three Days, Easter and Ordinary Time. The Liturgical Year begins on the first Sunday of Advent, which usually occurs around the beginning of December or the end of November, and ends on the feast of Christ the King.

However, the purpose of the Liturgical Year Calendar is not to mark the passage of time, but to celebrate and understand more fully the entire mystery of Jesus Christ, from his incarnation and birth until his ascension, the day of Pentecost, and the expectation of his return in glory. During the course of a year, the paschal mystery—the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus—is viewed from different angles, in different lights.

Parishioners are invited to join us for **Rosary and Litany** on **Wed at 6:30 pm** and **Adoration on Fri** beginning at **3 pm**.
